ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 25-15**

**Additional Hogan Lovells US LLP Attorneys Eligible for Receiving *Pro Bono*

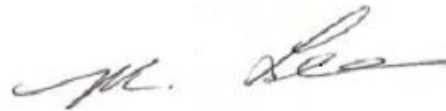
NOW, THEREFORE, it is by the Court,
