Filing instructions: Applications must be sent as an attachment in both a PDF and WORD document by email to applicant@dsc.gov. In the subject line of the email list the following: Last name of applicant, first name, middle initial, followed by a notation that it is an application of a Provisional Attorney. Please deliver a hard copy of the application to the Chambers of Judge Rainey Brandt, Co-chair of the Criminal Justice Act Attorney Selection Committee, D.C. Superior Court, Chambers 2130.

Note: Failure to file a timely application result in the attorney’s term as a Provisional Panel member expiring and the attorney no longer being a member of the Panel. Incomplete applications will not be considered. No notice will be provided to the applicant concerning failure to complete the application.

A passport size photo, Certificates Concerning Discipline from the Office of Bar Counsel of the District of Columbia, and certification that D.C. Bar dues have been paid currently must be included with the application. **While a resume is not required, should you attach one, please do not answer the questionnaire by stating, “See resume.”**

Deadline: Applications must be received on or before 5:00 p.m. October 31, 2023.

 - d. a description of at least two felony jury trials in which you have been second chair (including the name, phone number and email address of the attorney with whom you second chaired, a description of the work you performed, and the presiding judge).
