

**SUPERIOR COURT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 26-11**

**Special Order Authorizing CJCC to Provide DHS/DME a Report on
Juvenile Delinquency Status in Support of Truancy Pilot**

WHEREAS, D.C. Code § 38–208(c-1)(1)-(2) requires the Mayor of the District of Columbia to establish a truancy pilot with the Department of Human Services (DHS) which includes referral of certain students to DHS for services; and

WHEREAS, D.C. Code § 38–208(c-1)(3)(D) requires DHS to publish reports analyzing the delinquency status of students referred to DHS for services as part of the truancy pilot, during specified time periods between 2023 and 2025; and

WHEREAS, D.C. Code § 22-4234(a)(4) requires the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) to receive information from, and give assistance to, other District of Columbia agencies concerned with, or affected by, issues of public safety and the criminal justice system; and

WHEREAS, D.C. Code § 22-4234(a)(9) requires the CJCC to conduct research and analysis on matters affecting public safety and criminal justice, including research and analysis utilizing behavioral health, physical health, employment, and education data; and

WHEREAS, D.C. Code § 5-113.01(b) requires the Metropolitan Police Department to share police and other law enforcement records with CJCC to support reporting pursuant to D.C. Code § 22-4234; and

WHEREAS, DHS and the Deputy Mayor for Education (DME) have requested assistance from the CJCC with completing the analysis of the delinquency status of students referred to DHS as part of the truancy pilot; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with D.C. Code § 16–2333(b)(5) the Court may permit inspection of police and other law enforcement records by any agency having a professional interest in the child or in the work of the law enforcement department; and

WHEREAS, the CJCC’s duties set forth in D.C. Code § 22-4234 provide a professional interest in both the children in the truancy pilot and the law enforcement department;

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby


ORDERED, that the CJCC may collect, inspect, and utilize personally identifiable data and information provided by the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) to conduct analysis on the delinquency status of the students who have participated in the truancy pilot; and it is further

ORDERED, in accordance with D.C. Code § 16–2333.03 the CJCC may share the aggregate results of the analysis with DHS and DME to assist their completion of the truancy pilot reports required by D.C. Code § 38–208(c-1); and it is further

ORDERED, that no report or analysis that CJCC shares pursuant to this Order shall contain any information from which it would be possible to identify any person mentioned in the police or other law enforcement records.
