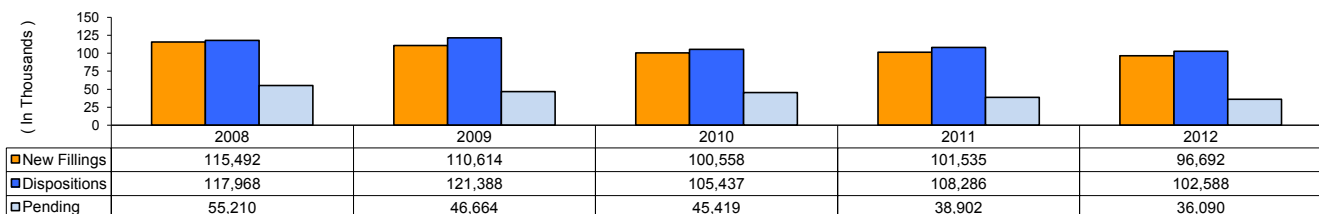

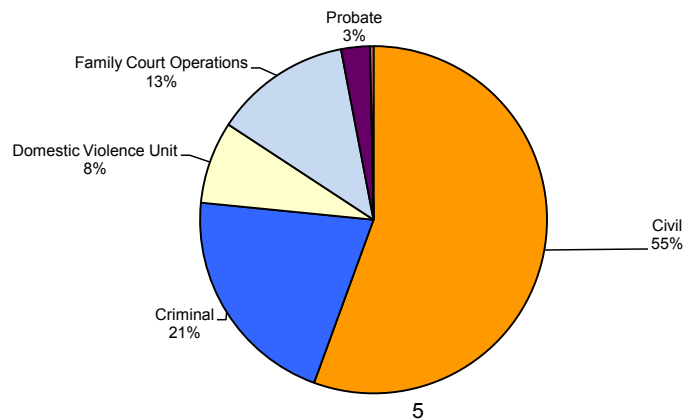

2012 New Case Filings (N=53,728)



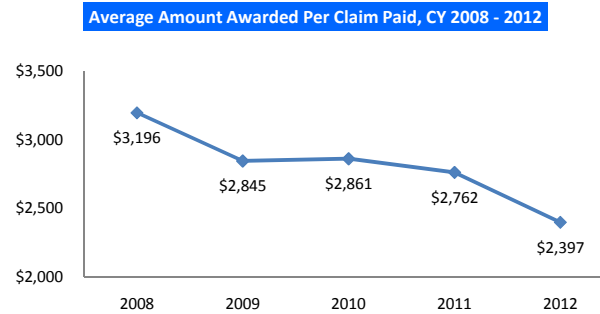
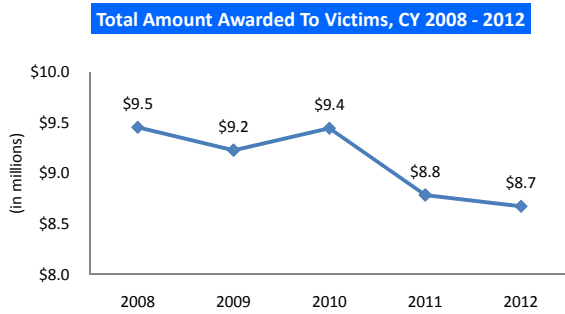
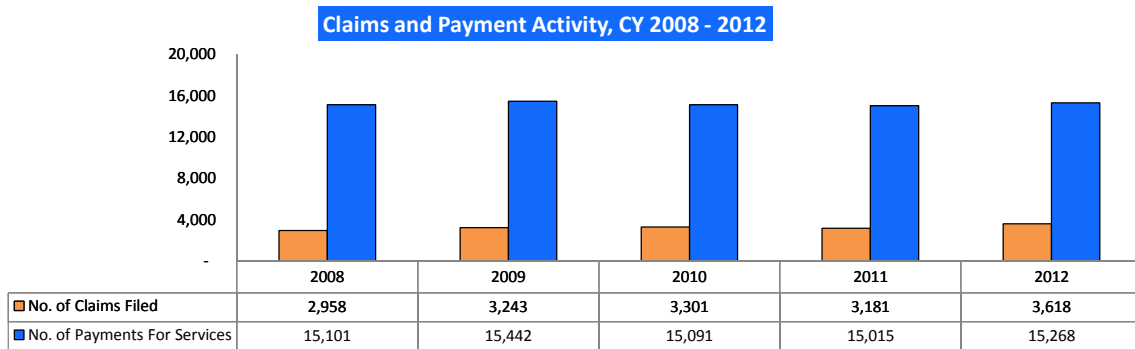

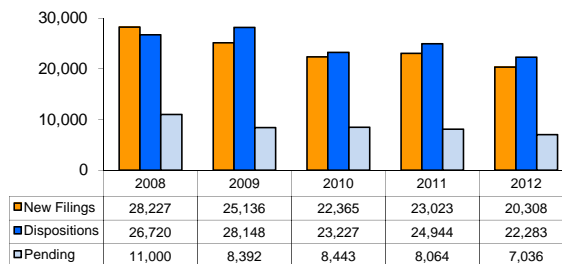

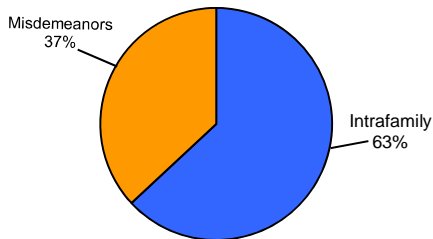

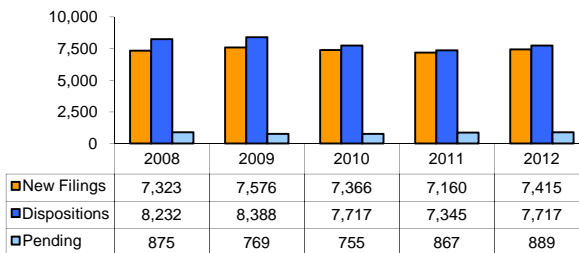

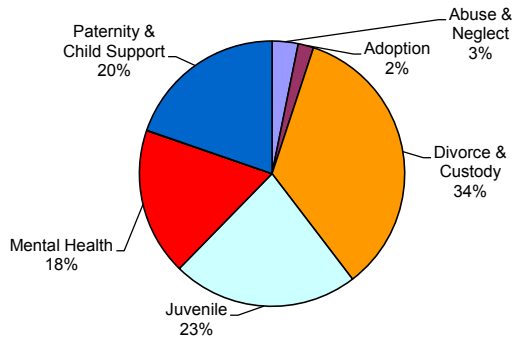

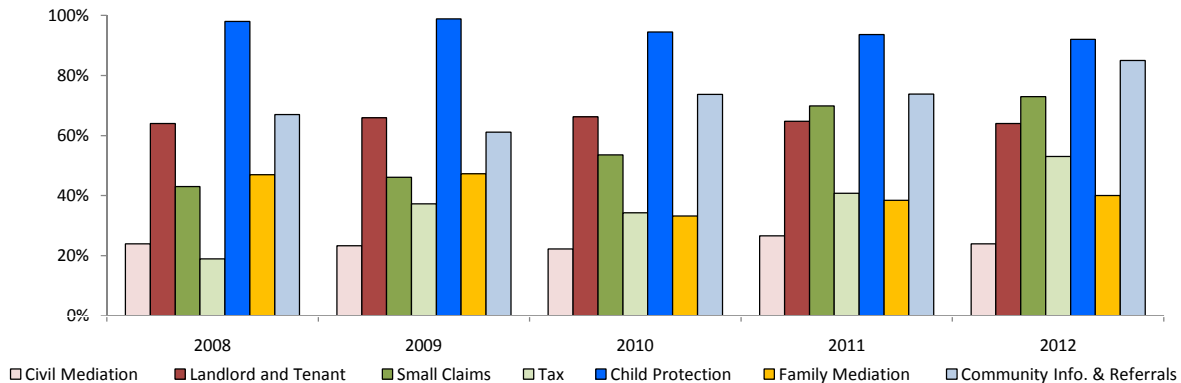

**Juror Utilization Rate, CY 2008-2012**





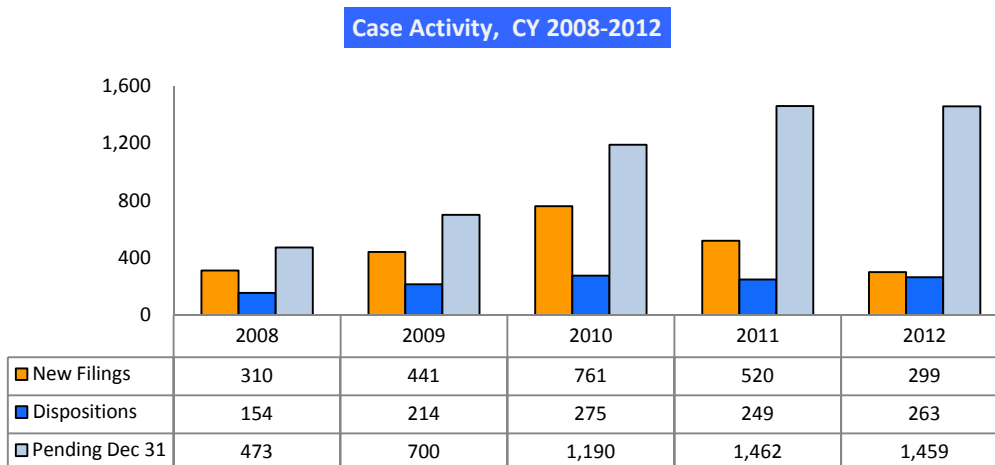

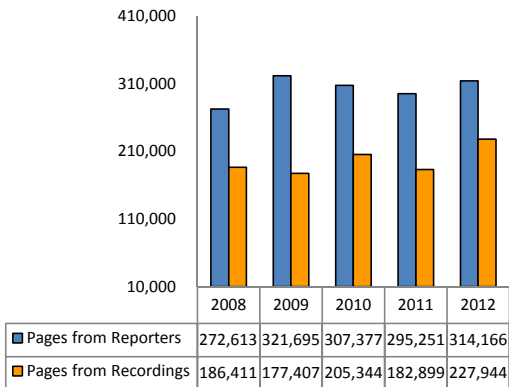
