## ABOUT US

The Crime Victims Compensation Program provides financial assistance and reimbursement to victims of crime and their families with crime related expenses.

A maximum of \$25,000 per claim may be paid for necessary crime related services. Certain expenses within the claim may be subject to individual sub-limits.

## WHO CAN APPLY?

To qualify for compensation, you must:

- Have suffered a personal injury as a result of a crime that occurred in D.C., or a family member of a victim of crime
- Report the crime within 7 days (some exceptions apply)
- Apply for assistance within 1 year of the date the crime occurred

## TYPES OF CRIMES COVERED BY THE PROGRAM

- Arson
- Assault
- Burglary
- Carjacking
- Cruelty to children
- Domestic violence
- Homicide
- Kidnapping
- Labor trafficking
- Malicious disfiguring
- Mayhem
- Riot
- Robbery
- Sex trafficking
- Sexual abuse or assault
- Sexual performance using a minor
- Stalking
- Terrorism
- Threats
- Traffic offenses (Impaired driving, reckless driving, etc.)
- Unlawful use of explosive
- Weapon of mass destruction

## COVERED EXPENSES

*The Program can reimburse for expenses such as:*

- *Medical/Dental*
- *Counseling*
- *Funeral bills*
- *Lost wages*
- *Loss of support*
- *Transportation*
- *Emergency temporary housing*
- *Moving and relocation*
- *Crime scene clean-up*

## DOCUMENTS NEEDED

- CVCP Application
- Valid Photo ID
- Crime Documents (such as police report, court orders)
- Other documents may be required with your application.
