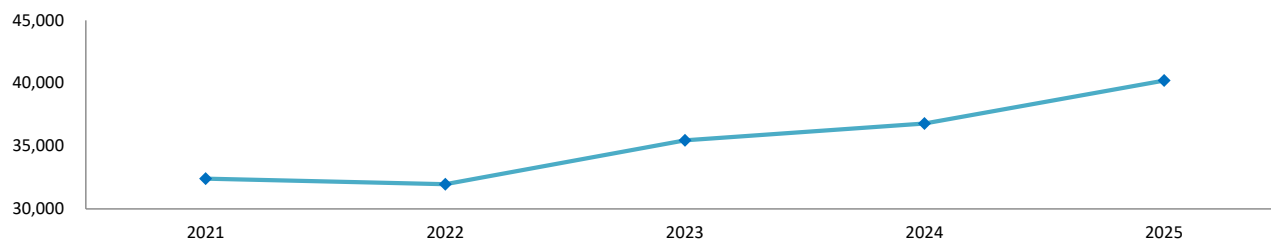

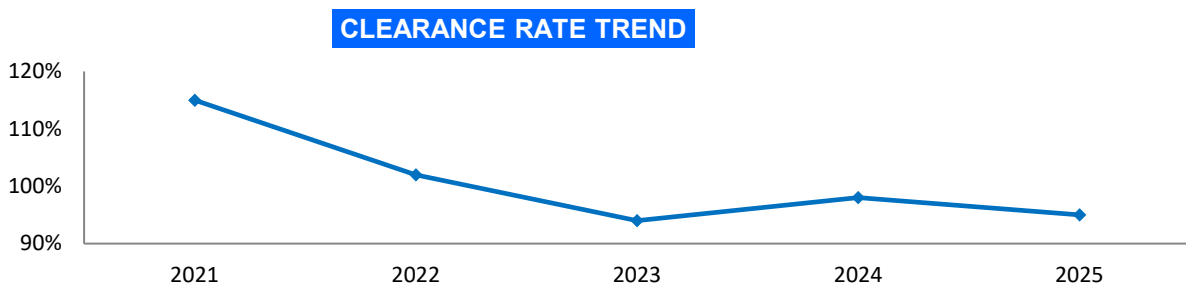

Trend in Appeals, CY2021-2025

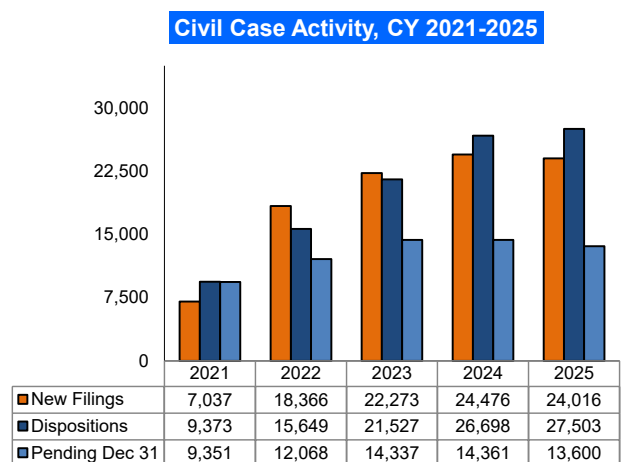
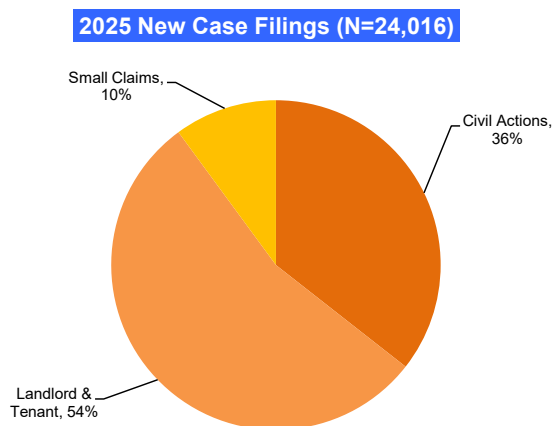

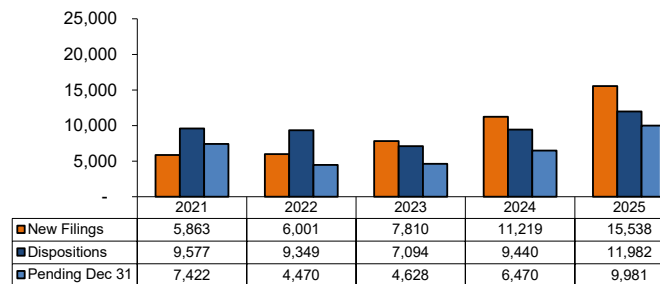

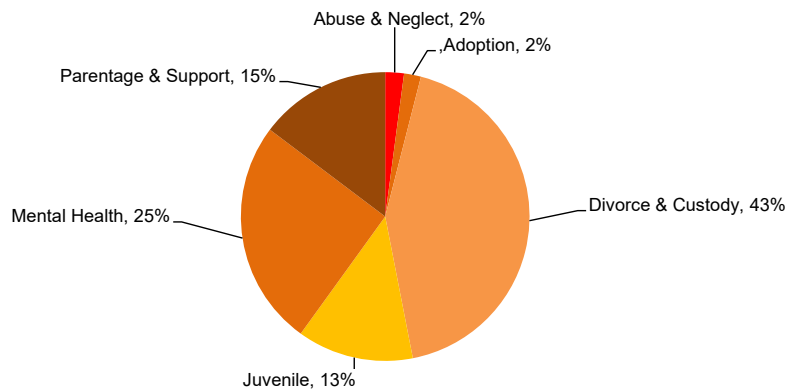

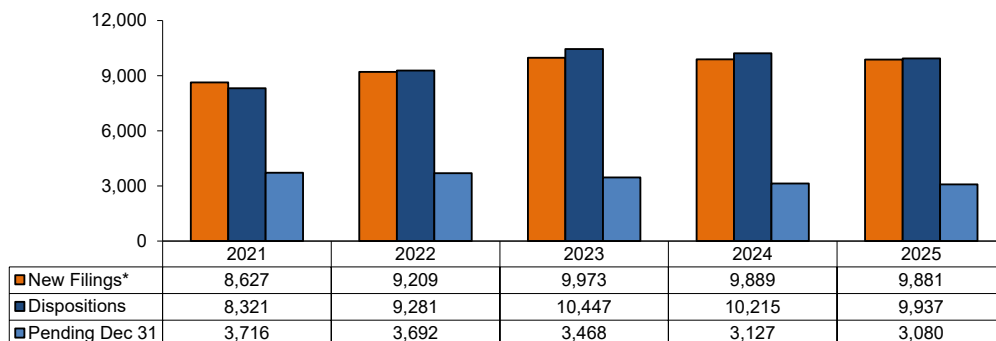

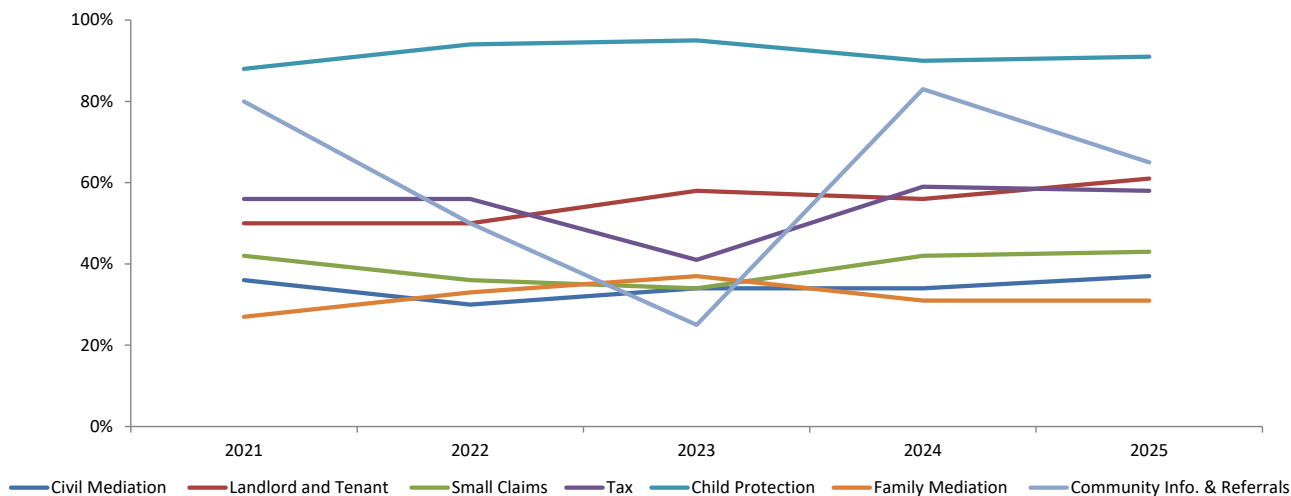

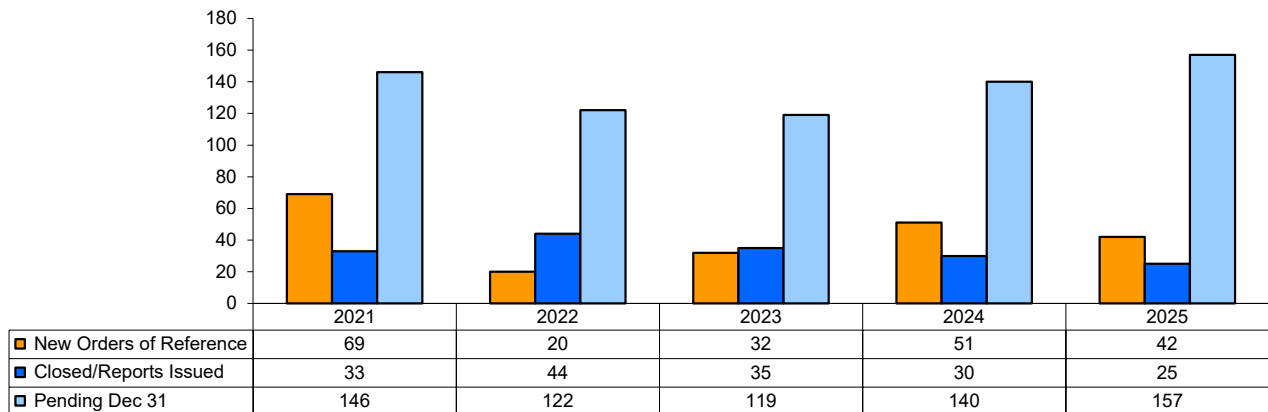

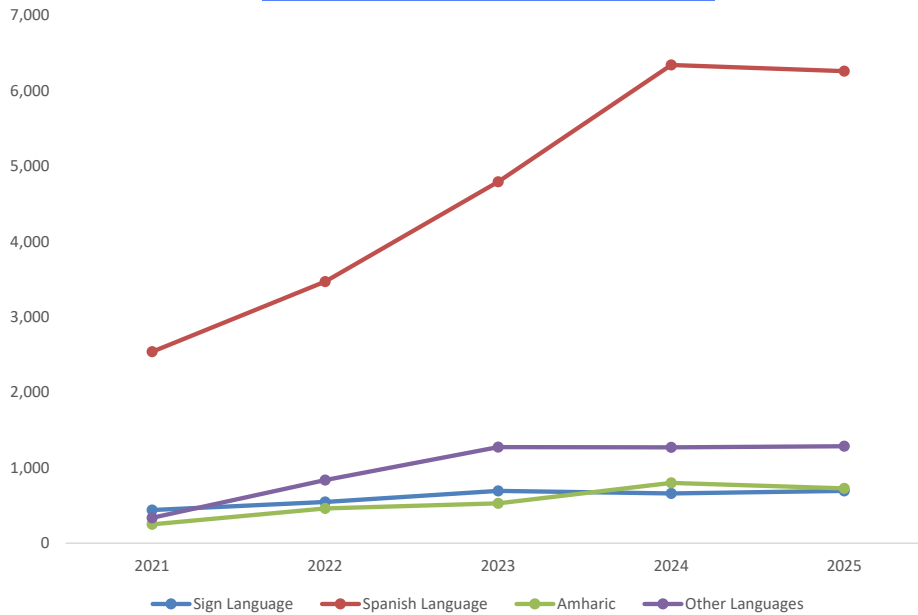

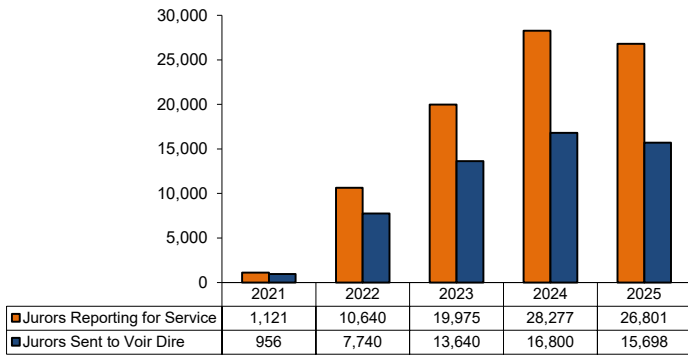

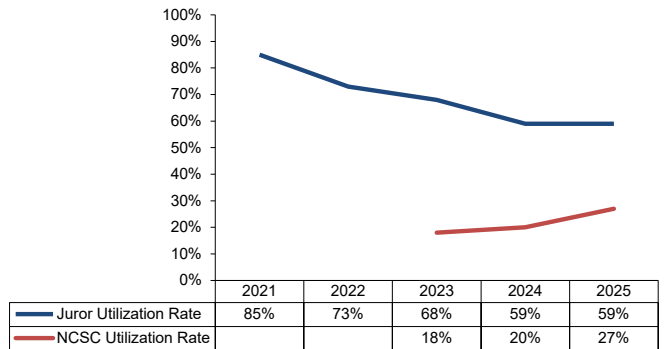

Tax Case Activity, CY 2021-2025

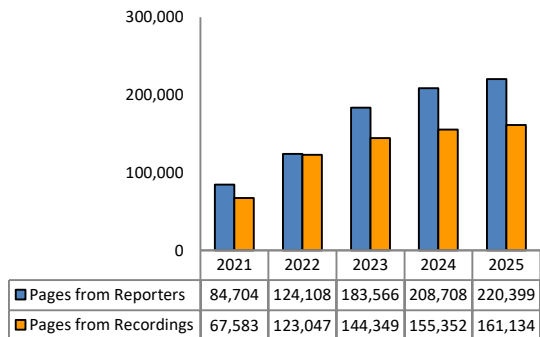

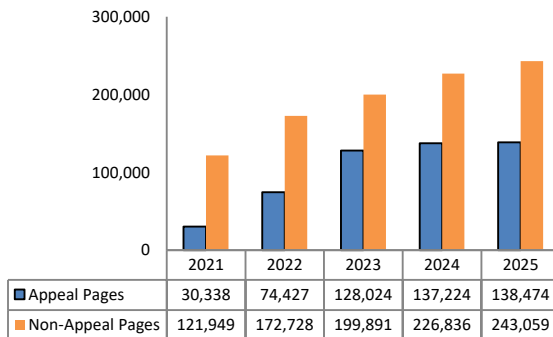
