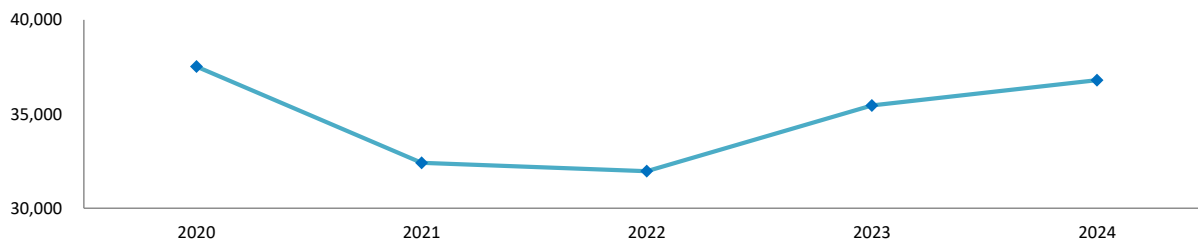

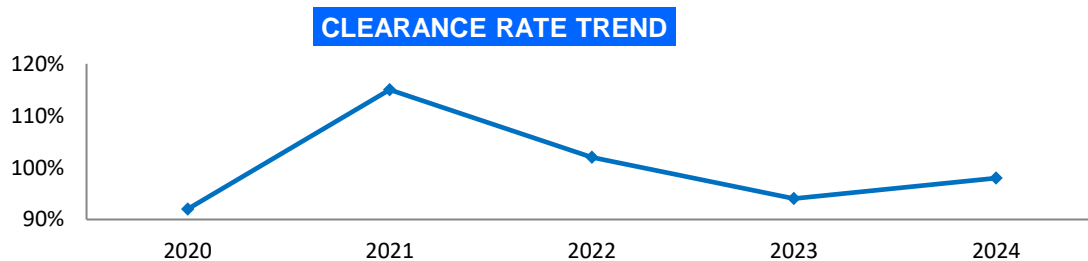

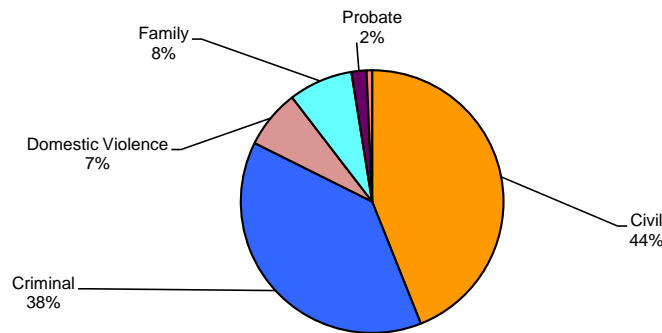

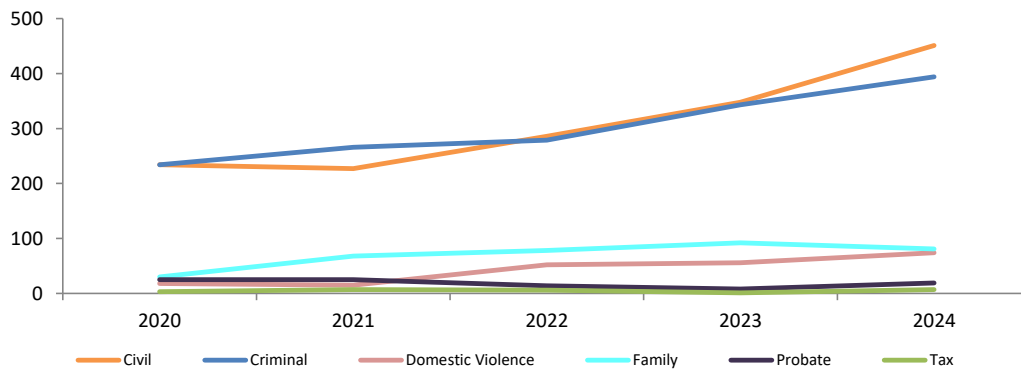

Trend in Appeals, CY2020-2024

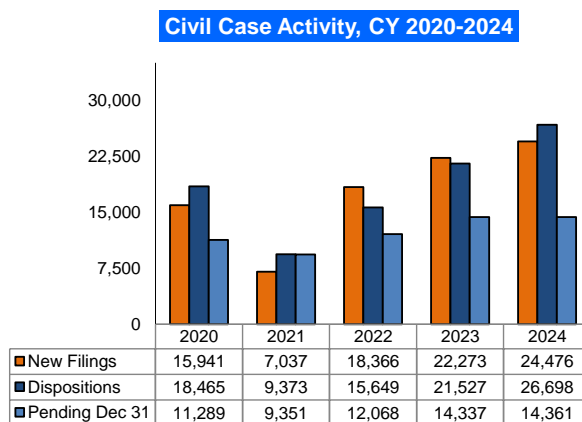
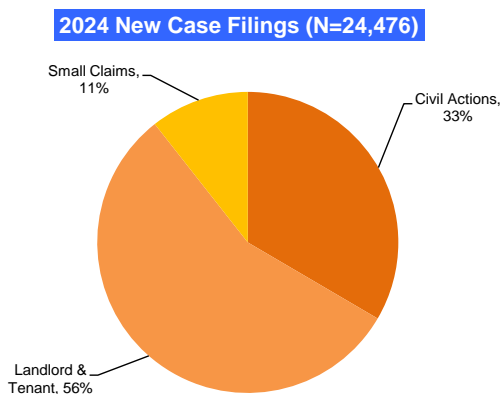

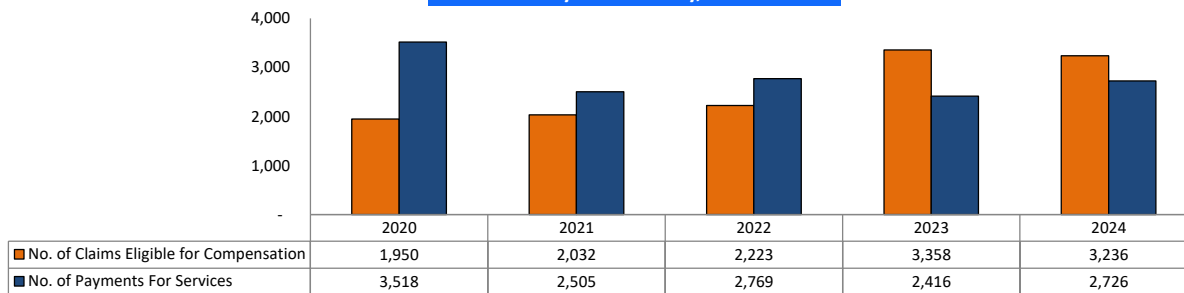

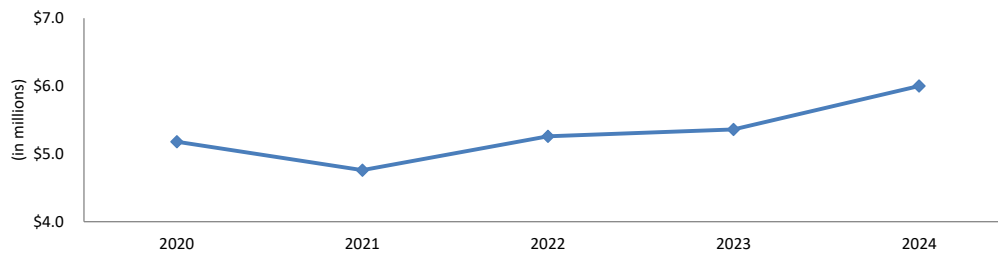

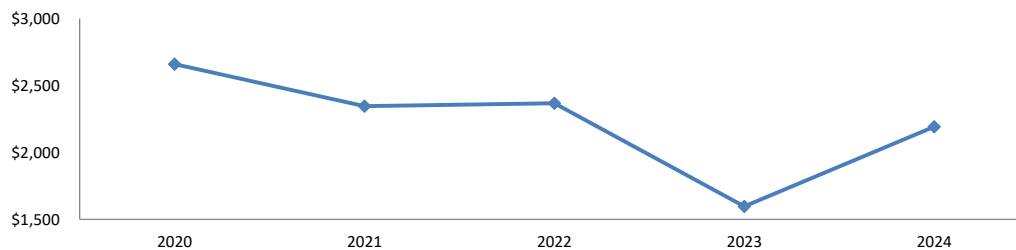
Claims and Payment Activity, CY 2020-2024

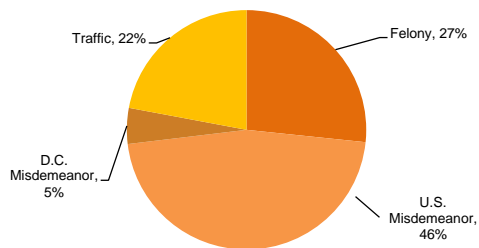

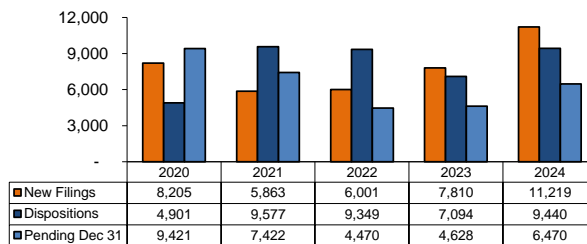

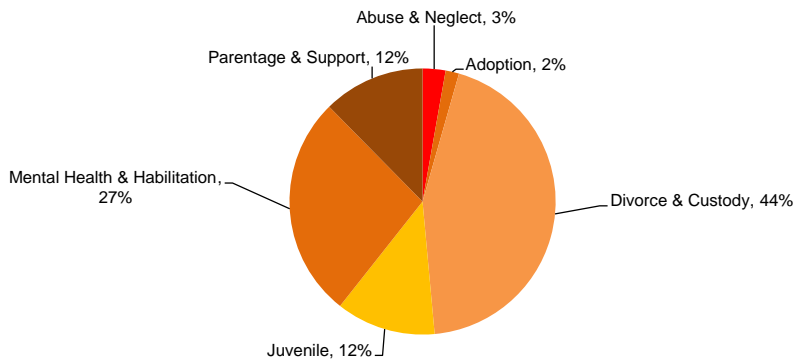

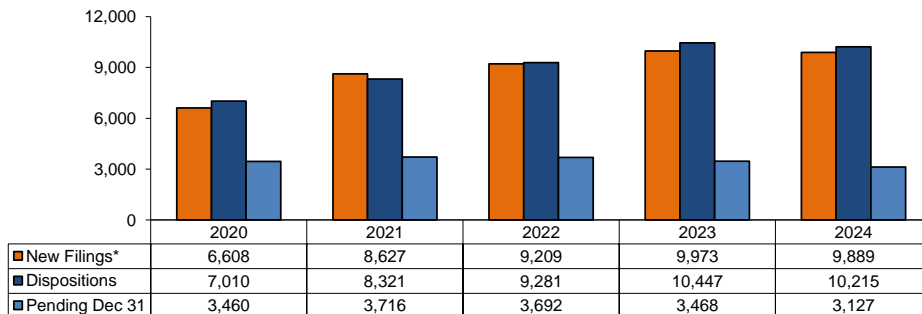

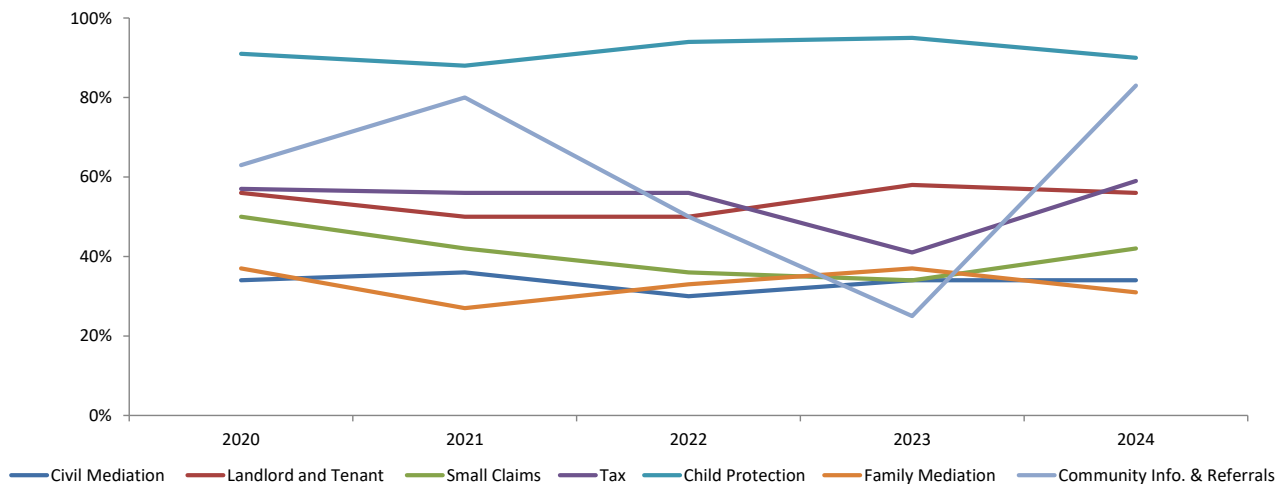

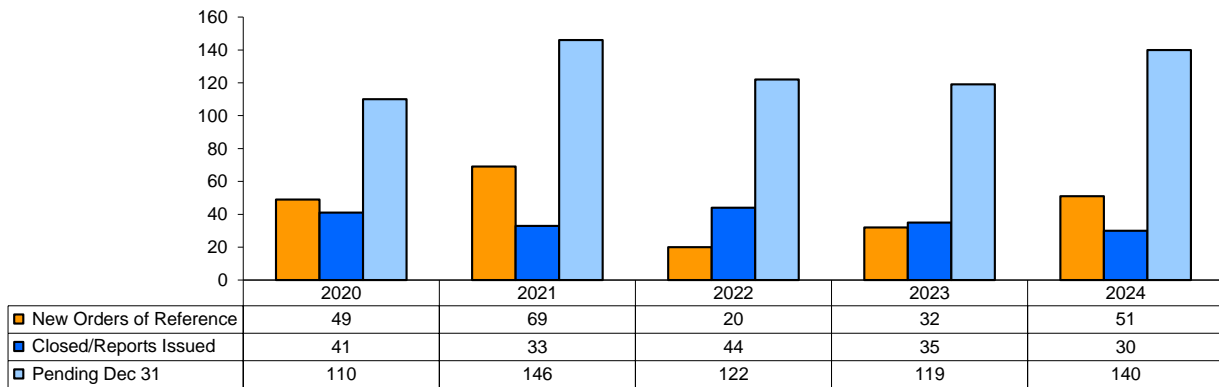

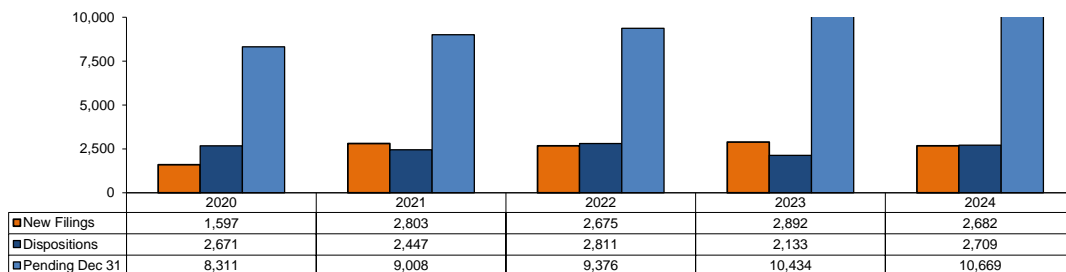

Probate Case Activity, CY 2020-2024



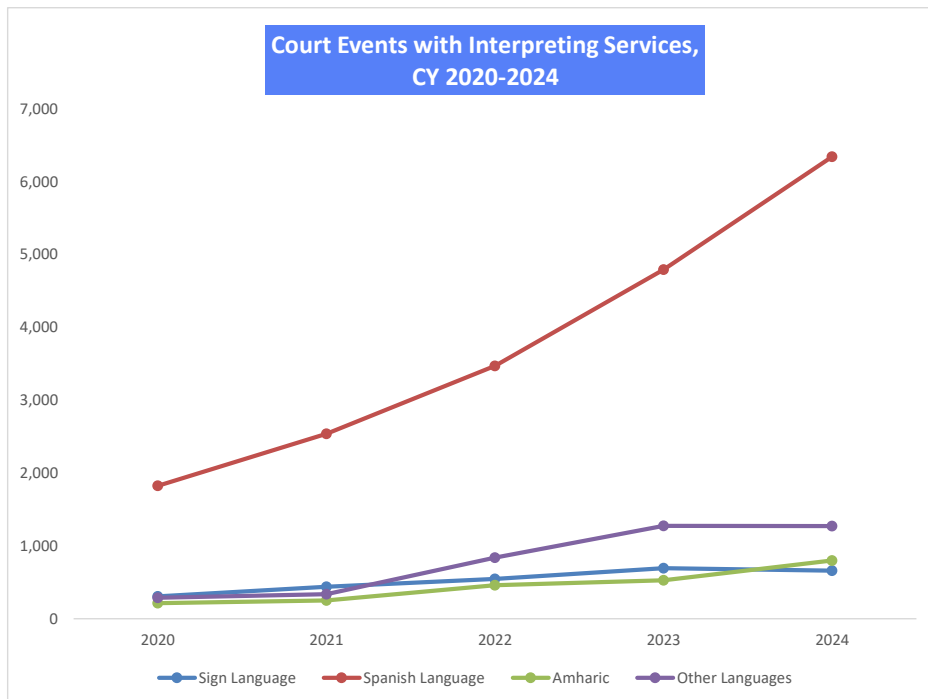

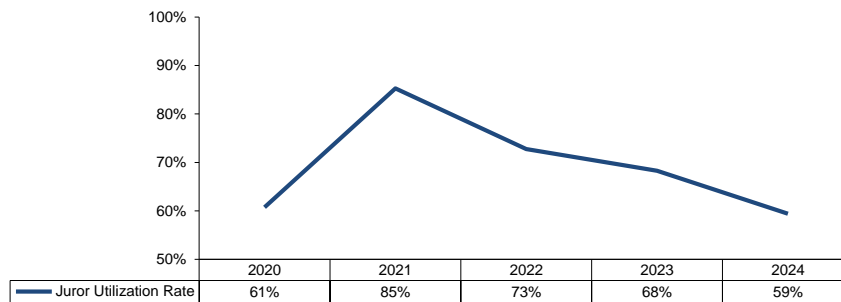

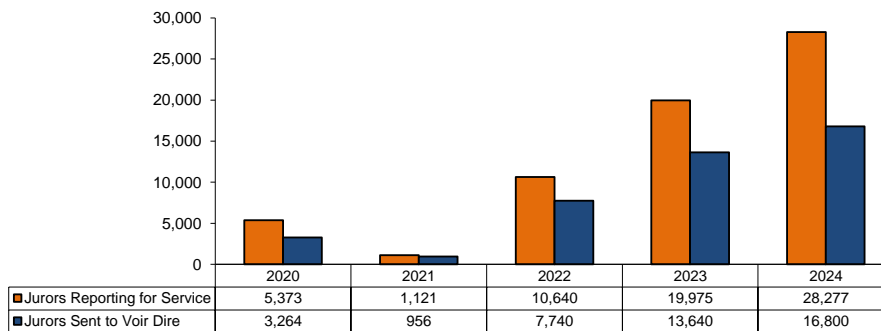

Tax Case Activity, CY 2020-2024

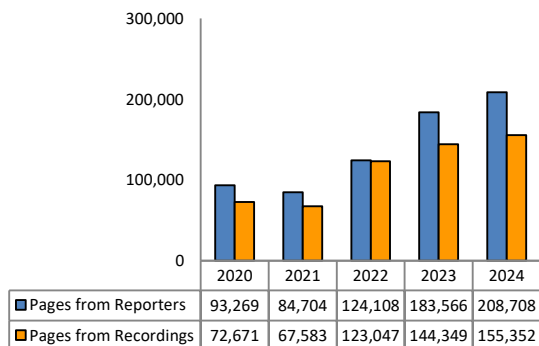

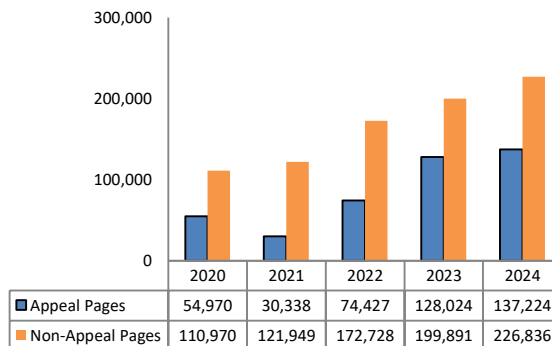
