How to Seal or Expunge Your Criminal Record

To keep your criminal history private, you can ask the court to seal or expunge your criminal record. Expunging a criminal record destroys the record. Sealing it hides the record from public view. Follow these steps to ask the court to seal or expunge your criminal record:

- 1) Call (202) 727-4245 to make an appointment with the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) to request a copy of your arrest history report.
- 2) Request the disposition of your case from DC Superior Court. Email your request to criminalcustomerservice@dcsc.gov or make a request in person at the Criminal Division clerk's office located at 500 Indiana Avenue NW, Washington, DC, in Room 4001 between 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.
- Once you have your arrest history report and your case disposition, prepare a
 motion to seal or expunge your criminal record or hire an attorney to prepare it for
 you.
- 4) When everything is ready, send all your documents (arrest record, case disposition, and motion to seal) to criminalmotionsealteam@dcsc.gov. The Seal Team will give your motion a case number and assign it to a judge to decide. This process can take up to six months.
