

The Court is satisfied that the plaintiff has made a diligent investigation of the Defendant's whereabouts for purposes of ordinary service of process. The search was not successful. Furthermore, the plaintiff has given an adequate explanation of why she should be allowed to serve the defendant through posting on the Court's website rather than by publication in a newspaper. The reason is economic.

WHEREFORE, it is by the Court this 26th day of January, 2021

ORDERED that Plaintiff's Motion to Authorize Service by Posting is hereby granted; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff may serve the Defendant Clavel by posting for
twenty-one calendar (21) days on the Court's Website.
